Sinhala Language Trainers (2 positions) – Consultants

Duration

Up to 220 days between October 2019 - March 2021

Role purpose

The Sinhala Language Trainers will be responsible for training National Institute for Language Education and Training (NILET) teachers and teacher trainers to teach communicative, learner-centred Sinhala language courses for public servants.

The commitment for this assignment is up to 220 days for the first position and up to 220 days for the second position over a One and half year period between October 2019 and March 2021. We expect the successful candidates to start work from the beginning of October 2019.

About us

The "Strengthening Reconciliation Processes in Sri Lanka" programme is jointly funded by the European Union (EU), the Foreign Office of the Federal Republic of Germany and the British Council. This four year programme aims at supporting Government, Non-Government and grassroots organisations to take joint responsibility in addressing key elements of the reconciliation process, and will be delivered by GIZ and the British Council.

Reducing Language Barriers is one of the key components of the programme which the British Council will deliver. The aim is to provide effective Tamil and Sinhala language courses for public servants in departments which work directly with the public, for example police stations, health centres and Divisional Secretariats. A team of British Council language specialists will work with government counterparts to develop

- appropriate, needs based placement testing, curricula, materials, and assessment for Tamil
 and Sinhala second language courses for public servants;
- trainers' and teachers' skills in communicative, learner centred second language methodology for teaching adults;
- public service managers' and heads of departments' good governance language awareness and language policy implementation skills.

Accountabilities, Responsibilities:

Materials development

- Sinhala Language Teaching Methodology Course: Translate into Sinhala the Tamil Language Teaching Methodology Course book.
- Practical Sinhala for Public Servants: Translate into Sinhala and adapt the Practical Tamil for Public Servants.
- Practical Tamil for Public Servants: edit and proof read the Sinhala sections in the Tamil textbook materials.

Sinhala Language Teaching Methodology Courses

- With supervision from the project, deliver the 120 hour Sinhala Language Teaching (SLT) Methodology Course for NILET approved language teachers;
- Organise the three—week teaching practice component of the SLT Methodology Course with parallel teaching practice groups and ensure quality lesson planning, teaching practice observation and feedback, and effective piloting of the new Sinhala language materials;
- Mentor NILET approved teacher trainers to co-deliver, and by 2020 deliver independently, the SLT Methodology Course.

Sinhala Language courses

- Conduct public servant participant selection (placement testing) and assessment (pre and post course testing and certification);
- Ensure the efficient and effective planning and delivery by NILET approved teachers of the 100-hour Practical Sinhala for Public Servants course in the Northern and Eastern Provinces:
- Follow-up NILET teachers' delivery of Practical Sinhala for Public Servants with classroom observation and feedback, planning, mentoring, and team teaching in targeted locations.

Assessment and course administration

- Carry out and maintain records on classroom assessments of NILET approved teachers and teacher trainers, using the formats and protocols developed by the project;
- Assist with the development and hand-over to NILET of the course administration system.
